
Moment of rural majesty sparks win

PORTRAITS of politicians, journalists and toddlers paled beside Self Portrait with a Cow at a new Tasmanian art prize.

Hilton Owen, 19, last night won the first RACT Insurance Portrait Prize.

Owen, of Rose Bay, said he wanted to reproduce a memorable moment in his life.

"There was a great feeling that came over me with being in a dry, dusty Richmond paddock next to a cow," he wrote with his entry.

"My mood was one of happiness, excitement and curiosity."

He won \$5000 and a trip to Sydney to view the Archibald Prize for Portraiture.

Runner-up was Ulverstone's Susannah Hart, also with a self-portrait.

Weeks of painstaking effort



creating his self-portrait with a mosaic of hardware-store colour chips paid off when he won the Organiser's Award.

"This one took about four to five weeks of pretty intense eight to 10-hour days of cutting and sticking with doublesided tape," Leary said.

He won \$500 and the RACT has bought his self-portrait for \$1800.
