TASMANIAN artist Jacob Leary has won a \$10,000 national art prize with a big, colourful installation he assembled in two days in a Sydney gallery.

Leary was one of 400 emerging artists from Australia and New Zealand who entered for the John Fries Memorial Prize.

His entry was initially a two-dimensional work but the judges were intrigued by pictures of a huge installation he did for his Masters degree at the University of Tasmania, They asked him to assemble an installation in Sydney for the finalists' exhibition.
